Spanning over eight decades, the exhibition focuses on ten visionary designers who have been core to the gallery's mission – including Ron Arad, Daniel Arsham, Estudio Campana, Wendell Castle, Misha Kahn, Shiro Kuramata, Joris Laarman, Gaetano Pesce, Samuel Ross, Ettore Sottsass, and Faye Toogood.

Expanding the dialogue in unprecedented ways, each work offers a snapshot of a key moment in the individual's own practice and within the canon of design. Exploring the breadth and diversity of the field and its capacity to reinvent itself, the setting will reflect on a legacy of cutting-edge innovation and an enduring impact in determining the tenets of design.

The exhibition seeks to reconcile a wide range of creative identities, backgrounds and processes by bringing these influential figures' seminal works into a dialogue. "Iconoclasts and Icons seeks to represent the chaos of contemporary design, distilling the explosive creative forces unleashed by the unending possibilities in our field," says Maro Benda.
